Qualities of a good or bad friend

Pupils' answers will vary but may include:

EXAMPLES FROM STAR WARS

Lando: Bad

- He doesn't warn his friends or help them escape.
- He pretends to be friendly and treat them well, when the whole time he knows that there is a trap waiting for them.
- He is putting himself first, trying to keep his city safe from Darth Vader, he makes a deal to turn his friends over to him.
- He is helping a bully and allowing himself to be bullied.

Han Solo: Bad

- He is only thinking of himself and the reward.
- He doesn't stay and help his friends, so that he can help himself.
- He goes off on his own, without his friends- when they need his help.

C-3PO: Good

- He tells the family about all the good qualities in his friend.
- He helps his friend get chosen.
- He speaks up so he and his friend, R2-D2, can stay together.

Han Solo B: Good

- He risks his life to help his friend.
- He chooses to not continue fixing his ship to leave and pay his debts to a bully, which would get himself out of trouble, to help get his friend, Luke, get out of trouble.

The ultimate bad guy:

Bully list (and reasons) can include:

Emperor Palpatine: turns people to the dark side. Often threatens people and has little feeling for others. Likes to control situations and others.

Jabba the Hutt: forces people to work for him. Punishes people around him when he is not happy. Likes to control situations and others.

Darth Vader: forces people to do things for him. Often shows little feeling for others. Threatens others. Likes to control situations and others.

Tusken Raiders: shows no feelings for others. Can hurt people, destroy property or take slaves.

Boba Fett: involved in forcing Lando Calrissian to hand over Han Solo to Jabba the Hutt. Has no feeling for others.
